

SUPREME COURT BUILDING CITY OF TALLAHASSEE Tom Hall is the 20th Clerk of the Court in its 168-year history and has served in this position since 2000. In a legal career spanning more than three decades, Tom has worked a quarter of a century in Florida's court system, with stints at two District Courts of Appeal as well as the Florida Supreme Court. He also spent several years in private practice, handling complex commercial litigation at both the trial and appellate levels.

Prior to his appointment as clerk at the Supreme Court of Florida in May 2000, Tom was chief staff attorney at the First District Court of Appeal. His first job out of law school was at the Third District Court of Appeal, where he was a law clerk to the Honorable Daniel S. Pearson.

At the Supreme Court, Tom has worked for eight chief justices and his tenure has stretched from Bush v. Gore in the fall of 2000 to the launch of the state's ePortal in the spring of 2013. The Court also tapped him to serve as acting marshal for a time.

Tom's service to the field of appellate practice in Florida was honored in 2009 when the Appellate Practice Section of The Florida Bar chose him for its James Adkins Award. His service to the National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks was recognized by that organization with its J.O. Sentell Award in 2012. He served as the group's president from August 2008 to August 2009.

He is a board member of the Florida Courts E-Filing Authority and a member of the Florida District Court of Appeal Performance & Accountability Commission. He was a charter member of the First District Appellate American Inn of Court.

Tom has taught widely – at law schools, judicial conferences and numerous Florida Bar programs and in other forums established for teachers and legal assistants. He has a remarkable resume of volunteer service in The Florida Bar.

The Supreme Court thanked Tom for his service with a proclamation it presented to him earlier this year. Tom has called his time at the Court the most satisfying of his career and the Justices of the Supreme Court honor Tom today by holding this Retirement Ceremony.
