**Airfare is not included in this promotion**, but is available for purchase through Collette. You may also book your own air, and our staff at WFSU will help you with your itinerary.

Transportation between cities and to organized activities is included.

If you've never traveled internationally, WFSU Travel Club staff will help you with the process. Our guests enjoy traveling with a like-minded group of WFSU listeners and viewers!

### **Day 1: Monday, December 8, 2025**

Board an overnight flight to Prague (airfare not included) and get ready for a grand holiday adventure through the

winter wonderland of the Imperial Cities of Central Europe – Prague, Vienna and Budapest. Along the way, immerse yourself in festive Christmas markets, enjoy traditional entertainment, sample local cuisine, and glimpse this region's rich history.

### **Day 2: Tuesday, December 9, 2025**

#### **Prague, Czech Republic - Tour Begins**

Arrive in Prague, the "City of 100 Spires." Behold ancient landmarks and medieval architecture. This evening, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. (D)

### **Day 3: Wednesday, December 10, 2025**

#### **Prague**

Feel the magic and wonder of Prague amid the holiday season. Your introduction to this fairy-tale city begins with a panoramic tour. Explore the "Castle District," including the gothic St. Vitus Cathedral and the majestic Prague Castle. Then decide how to further explore Prague because **it's your choice!** Learn more about the city's Jewish heritage and visit Europe's oldest active synagogue\* on a heritage tour **-OR-** board a boat to see a different side of Prague on a Vltava River cruise. The remainder of your afternoon and evening is at leisure to take in the best Prague has to offer independently. Take in the iconic, statue-lined Charles Bridge, a picturesque structure stretching over the Vltava River, and don't miss the famous Christmas market in Prague's Old Town Square, where brightly decorated wooden huts are filled with the work of local artisans, and traditional food and drink are prepared right in front of you. ### **Day 4: Thursday, December 11, 2025**

#### **Prague - Dresden, Germany - Prague, Czech Republic**

Travel to Dresden, Germany, known as "Florence on the Elbe." Meet a local guide for a tour highlighting its' baroque splendor and architectural treasures such as Frauenkirche (Church of Our Lady) and the Royal Palace. Visit the world's oldest Christmas market – the Striezelmarkt – which has been delighting travelers and locals alike since 1434. Take time to explore the stalls overflowing with ornaments, sample local sweets and get lunch on your own before returning to Prague later in the afternoon. (B)

### **Day 5: Friday, December 12, 2025**

#### **Prague - Český Krumlov - Vienna, Austria**

Depart Prague and travel through the scenic countryside on your way to Vienna, Austria. En route, make a stop in the medieval town of Český-Krumlov. Lined with towering



Baroque architecture, explore the quaint-preserved streets independently and have time for lunch on your own. Continue to a typical Viennese restaurant and indulge in dinner with breathtaking imperial charm. After, arrive in the grand city of Vienna, capital of Austria, aglow with holiday lights, and perhaps join your Tour Manager for an evening stroll. (B, D)

### **Day 6: Saturday, December 13, 2025**

#### **Vienna**

This morning, meet your local guide on a scenic bus ride and walking tour to Vienna's city center and behold the beautiful architecture, scenic parks, and Gothic spires that fill the city. Learn more about Vienna's sweet confectionery history when you visit a candy workshop where candies are still being made according to traditional recipes dating back over 150 years. An afternoon at leisure allows time to visit the Christkindlmarkt, perhaps the biggest and most famous in the city, at the neo-gothic Rathaus City Hall.

Tonight, you may choose an option to explore the Christmas market and the interiors at the magnificent Schönbrunn Palace, together with a classical music performance at the famous Orangerie where the past comes alive. (B)

### **Day 7: Sunday, December 14, 2025**

#### **Vienna - Bratislava, Slovakia - Budapest, Hungary**

Hop aboard a train to Bratislava, the former Imperial capital of the Hapsburg Empire. Enjoy free time to have lunch and explore some of the city's 4,000-year-

old history independently – don't miss the charming Christmas markets! Continue through the Hungarian countryside to spend an afternoon at a beautiful rustic local restaurant preserving 200-years of typical Hungarian cultural and architectural traditions. Learn how to make traditional strudel before enjoying a typical Hungarian dinner. Later this evening, arrive in Budapest, the "Queen of the Danube" and your home for the next 2 nights. Enjoy the evening on your own or join your Tour Manager for an evening walk. (B, D)

### **Day 8: Monday, December 15, 2025**

#### **Budapest**

Join a local expert for a panoramic tour of the city, where you'll discover the incredible neo-gothic marvel of Matthias Church atop Buda Castle Hill, the Fisherman's Bastion, the historic Old Buda and Gellert Hill, and the parliament House. This afternoon, enjoy some free time to explore Budapest on your own. Perhaps you will visit the cozy Christmas market at St. Stephen's Basilica with its ice rink and gorgeous tree, or head to the city's largest market at Vörösmarty Square brimming with food and crafts stalls where local musicians often perform. This evening join your fellow travelers to toast the end of a festive trip at a farewell dinner. (B, D)

### **Day 9: Tuesday, December 16, 2025**

**Tour Ends** Say goodbye to these regal cities as your tour comes to a close today. (B)

### **Christmas Markets**

Few things invoke the feel of old-world holiday traditions more than the spectacular European Christmas Markets. From November until Christmas these outdoor markets dot the Imperial Cities like a string of ornaments on a tree. Be transported back in time to a winter wonderland of open-air market stalls brimming with ornaments, handmade crafts, specialty food and warming beverages. Watch people spin on the ice of the outdoor rink in Vienna, see its lovely carousel and twinkling light installations. Prague is particularly lovely in the Advent season when its squares are festively transformed, and you can shop and sip to your heart's content as classical musicians perform, and choirs sing timeless songs of the season. Good cheer abounds in Budapest's largest market which glistens against the backdrop of the city's gorgeous St. Stephen's Basilica. Indulge in a timeless European holiday on this very special Christmas Markets tour.

## PLEASE NOTE:

**The overall activity level of this tour is a level 3.** This means you're an on-the-go traveler. You don't want to miss a thing, so walking and standing for longer periods of time (2-3 hours) isn't a big deal. A moderately paced two-and-a-half-hour walking tour, covering several miles, hills, and uneven surfaces, is no problem for you. Walking four miles over the course of a day is very doable, as is climbing into and out of various modes of transportation (tuk-tuk, cable car, zodiac, etc.). You can climb three flights of stairs easily and handle altitudes between 6,000 and 9,000 feet. Expect some longer days with early mornings or late nights balanced with free time to recharge or set out on your own adventure. This level is not a fit for travelers who require mobility assistance devices.

If you've chosen the Jewish Heritage Tour option as your selected Choice on Tour, combined with the Prague Castle tour, it will include up to 4 hours of walking with stops. The Budapest walking tour will last up to 3 hours with stops.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

This is a winter program, and you can expect surfaces covered with frost, snow, or ice.

This tour features multiple long transfers exceeding 2 hours, in particular the transfer to and from Dresden, Germany. The transfer from Prague to Vienna, Austria with stops in between, can take up to 10 hours.

The longest day will require a departure from the Vienna hotel at 8:00 am for your train to Bratislava. In Bratislava, you will continue traveling by coach, arriving at the Budapest hotel after 7:00 pm.

\*Prague Synagogue is closed on Saturdays (due to Shabbat) and on Jewish holidays.

Most of the cities on this program are very busy during Advent.

Included breakfasts are buffet breakfasts.

Not all major sites can be reached by coach. Public transportation might be used during the Budapest city tour.

To complete your tour, if you purchase airfare from Collette, roundtrip airport-to-hotel transfers are included. If you arrange your own airfare, we are pleased to provide you the option of *purchasing* these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

### IDENTIFICATION

Passports are required for this tour at your expense. Certain countries require that your passport be valid at least 6 months beyond the dates of your travel. You are strongly urged to contact the appropriate consulate for details. Visit [www.travel.state.gov](http://www.travel.state.gov) for the U.S. State Department for the latest details about passports and visa requirements.

**IMPORTANT:** We recommend that travelers take a photocopy of their passport and applicable visas. It should be packed separately from your actual passport and visa. We also recommend leaving a copy at home with your emergency contact.



*Effective for travel in May 2025, all visitors who do not need a visa to enter Europe will be expected to apply for an ETIAS visa waiver, for a fee (usually under \$10 per person), when visiting a Schengen Area Country. To identify Schengen Area Countries and to complete the ETIAS application, please visit <https://www.etiasvisa.com/>*

Visitors are required to show proof of travel medical insurance to travel to the Czech Republic. The health insurance must cover medical services abroad with specific coverages. Please visit <https://travel.state.gov> (the U.S. State Department) for the latest details with regards to entry requirements. If you have **purchased our Travel Protection Plan**, your coverage meets this requirement.

Travel Protection is available for purchase for \$549 per person to cover the land and air portions of this trip when booked through Collette. Lower rates are available for the land-only portion, if you book your own air.
